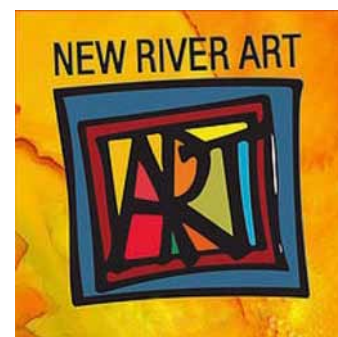
The Blacksburg Regional Art Association is pleased to announce the 15th New River Art Juried Biennial 2019 is now open for entries.

For the first time ever, the biennial will take place in the beautiful Moss Arts Center at Virginia Tech. The area of eligibility will be a radius of 170 miles from Blacksburg versus the most often used distance of 150 miles. This expansion was decided upon due to the spectacular facility made available for the show. This facility will allow for more and larger pieces to be exhibited than ever before and is expected to draw a high caliber of fine arts ranging from paintings to sculptures, textiles and more. Due to the excellent video capabilities of the center, video entries will be accepted for the first time.

Juror for the show was selected by the Moss Arts Center and is Emily Smith, executive director of 1708 Gallery, a non-profit contemporary art space in Richmond. Other art affiliations include the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond, Piedmont Arts in Martinsville, Second Street Gallery in Charlottesville, and Patrick Henry Community College in Martinsville. She holds a masters in art history from the University of Virginia.

The Power of Art in the Palm of the Hand **January 31, 2019**

Carilion Clinic Foundation invites professional artists to create an original work of art for a silent auction during an annual fundraising event on January 31. This is an opportunity for local artists to create small scale works of art that are meant to be treasured as closely as that which is held in the palm of one's hand. They invite submissions of different mediums and forms, including sculpture, pottery, painting, illustration, photography, and woodwork. The overall area of a two-dimensional piece must not exceed 25 inches (area of any frame not to exceed 39 square inches). Sculptures may not exceed 5 inches in any direction. The artist will receive 50% of the realized sales price (before sales tax) for the creation; the remaining 50% of the realized sales price will benefit the Dr. Robert L. A. Keeley Healing Arts Program at Carilion Clinic. Any items not sold will be returned to the artist. To participate, email healingarts@carilionclinic.org, to receive an entry form. Deadline is **December 31, 2018**.
